Distractions will come, but you don't have to be dominated by them. Keep moving forward.

<u>Context</u>

- Parents teaching their children God's wisdom 4:1 <u>Hear, O sons</u>, a father's instruction, and be attentive, that you may gain insight...¹⁰ <u>Hear, my son</u>, and accept my words, that the years of your life may be many...²⁰ <u>My son</u>, be attentive to my words; incline your ear to my sayings.
- Parents helping their children prioritize: God's wisdom deserves our total attention – 4:20-22 My son, be attentive to my words; incline your ear to my sayings. ²¹ Let them not escape from your sight; keep them within your heart. ²² For they are life to those who find them, and healing to all their flesh.

Q: What does it mean to guard your heart?

A: To keep, watch over, keep from¹ as a guard protects what is valuable.

Proverbs 13:3

Whoever <u>quards</u> his mouth preserves his life; he who opens wide his lips comes to ruin.

Psalm 16:1

Preserve me, O God, for in you I take refuge.

Proverbs 16:17

The highway of the upright turns aside from evil; whoever <u>guards</u> his way preserves his life.

Proverbs 21:23

Whoever <u>keeps</u> his mouth and his tongue <u>keeps</u> himself out of trouble.

Psalm 25:20

Oh, <u>guard</u> my soul, and deliver me! Let me not be put to shame, for I take refuge in you.

Ways to quard your heart

• Filter what you put in – 4:23 Keep your heart with all vigilance, for from it flow the springs of life.

"The secret of my success? It is simple. It is found in the Bible, 'In all thy ways acknowledge Him and He shall direct thy paths.'" (Proverbs 3:6) – George Washington Carver

• Evaluate the words that come out – 4:24 Put away from you crooked speech, and put devious talk far from you.

Matthew 6:21

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

 Assess where your thoughts drift – 4:25-27 Let your eyes look directly forward, and your gaze be straight before you. ²⁶ Ponder the path of your feet; then all your ways will be sure. ²⁷ Do not swerve to the right or to the left; turn your foot away from evil.
