## Romans 1:7-10

To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. <sup>8</sup> First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed in all the world. <sup>9</sup> For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you <sup>10</sup> always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you.

- You can live in a rough place in rough times and still can be loved by God – 1:7a To all those in Rome who are loved by God and called to be saints:
- You can be a part of God's work in the world by delivering to others what God has given you – 1:7b Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- The Gospel steadily reshapes what we're grateful for –
  1:8 First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed in all the world.
- The Gospel creates a deep sense of longing to be with other believers – 1:9-10 For God is my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of his Son, that without ceasing I mention you 10 always in my prayers, asking that somehow by God's will I may now at last succeed in coming to you.
